
The street lights work has already begun and the upgraded ramp access will commence in the next few weeks.

# **ST JOSEPH'S HOUSE**

It is a very busy and exciting time for St Joseph's House. We are delighted to advise that three of our service users have secured their own home which meets their housing profile criteria.

We are delighted with the high standard of the accommodation and how accessible it is from a functional point of view. There is now a transition programme in place to ensure they are fully supported in their own homes. It is important to highlight that from identification of a suitable home to moving in will generally take between 3-6 months and is person dependant.

Discovery is progressing well and we now have 10 service users spending one to one time each week with our Discovery Co-ordinators. There are now 2 Full time Discovery Co-ordinators and 2 Part Time Discovery Co-ordinators and we have recruited a Community Integration Co-ordinator to assist with Assistive Technology and IT as we transition to a community service. We have also recruited a temporary driver to assist the house with transport.

We are carrying out a rolling recruitment at present which means we will be hiring staff on a regular basis so we can train and support them in-house whilst ensuring they also get to know the people who are currently living in SJH.

An 'FAQ' was issued on the project recently to ensure everyone has access to the same information. Our staff training program is continuing with HACCP, Dysphasia and Dementia all ongoing. Good luck to our staff who have now completed their Irish Sign Language training courses and exams for levels 3 and 4, and awaiting results.
