

Since the last publication of the Newsletter, life in Boarding has been busy with boarders involved in various fun-filled activities, programmes and events. Our new group of boarders have settled in well, enjoying the home from home experience and making a new network of friends.

Both girls and boys completed a 6 week programme, called the Healthy Food Made Easy programme: A community cooking programme that was developed under the Slaintecare Healthy Communities. There was great interest from both boys and girls with this programme, and on average we had 14-16 participants each week. This course was run in Joe's and the facilitator would call in each week to help boarders improve their cooking skills, eating behaviours and nutrition knowledge.



Each week the boarders with the support of the chef made a healthy meal, and enjoyed the rewards at the end of each session. The aim of the programme is to help you make healthier food choices within budget. This course was ISL supported by our own staff interpreters. The facilitator who organised this course for us, had the following to say, "I really just wanted to say a huge thank you to those of you who hosted the 'Healthy Food Made Easy class." In particular, thank you to our partners ... that allow us to use their kitchen facilities...since we do not have kitchens of our own, this is invaluable, and we have not had to turn anyone away because of your dedication to your community. A most sincere thank you"

We are booked in again for this course for our senior boarders to help them prepare for independent living and this will commence in January 2025.


